**Announcements:** Attending members reviewed the Chapter's 2008-2009 Membership Handbook for additions and corrections. Comp. Harold Wright noted the Flag Day program to be held at the Veteran's Park on Sat., 14 June. Chaplain Rev. McAbee noted the passing of Compatriot Henry Bragg. Comp. Bragg was a veteran of World War Two, and a founding member of our chapter. Comp. Jim Alexander announced the National Congress to be held in California in July. He and Comp. Jim Maples reported on the ALSSAR's May 2008 BOM meeting.

Comp. Morgan created and published, at the national level, a list of tips for applicants. He also explained the SAR Robert E. Burt BSA Volunteer Award Medal, of which he is a recipient.

The Tennessee Valley Chapter was chartered on March 16, 1958. On a list given to Bill Pittman in 1983 by the Alabama Society President there were 17 charter members of the chapter. Tenn. Valley Ch. Anniversary Steering Committee: Jim Alexander, Bob Adams, Richard Smallwood, Jim Maples, Mrs. Linda Maples, Mrs. Abby Alexander, Mrs. Glenda Smallwood, and Mrs. Rane'e' Pruitt.

**Events:** Preparation for the fiftieth anniversary of the Tennessee Valley Chapter are underway for the October meeting.

**Program:** Mr. James Flinn III, former deputy to the Commanding General U.S. Army Missile Command, addressed the impact of the Base Realignment and Closure program on Redstone Arsenal, Huntsville, and Madison County. He reported the present and future personnel demographics, and army commands regarding Redstone Arsenal. Currently, 25,000 to 26,000 personnel are on the Arsenal each work day. The number of commanding generals at RSA will increase from five to thirteen. Future personnel numbers for RSA are estimated at: 400 military, 2,300 engineers, 1,600 business, and 400 administrators. Concerns for an adequate work force were addressed. RSA was selected for base consolidations as a result of an independent study.

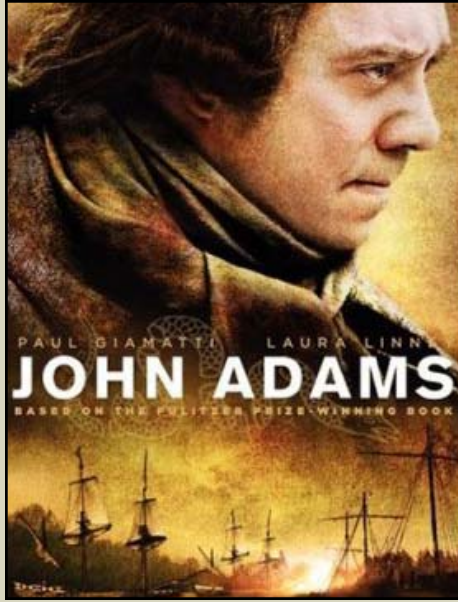

### *John Adams*

Earlier this year HBO showed a seven-part series entitled *John Adams* based on David McCullough's book by the same name. The series has been recently released on DVD.
